ORDINANCE 2023-21

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BUNNELL, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 62 TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES, ARTICLE II STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING, BY CREATING CERTAIN PROHIBITIONS, ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS AND FINE AMOUNTS FOR CITATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY PARKING ENFOCEMENT SPECIALIST; AND AMENDING CHAPTER II- ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE III OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, BY REMOVING CERTAIN PROVISONS OF SECTION 2-79-DISPOSITION OF CIVIL PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERANCE OF INVALID PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes authorizes a municipality to enact regulations to protect the health, safety and welfare, and interests of the citizens of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bunnell has a significant interest in providing a safe and pleasant environment and in eliminating public nuisances; and

WHEREAS, Part B, Chapter 62, Article II, of the Bunnell Code of Ordinances creates certain prohibitions and allows parking enforcement specialist or law enforcement officers to issue parking citations for certain violations.; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Bunnell finds it is in the best interest and welfare of the citizens of the City to establish additional prohibitions and to establish civil penalties for parking citations for certain violations; and

WHEREAS, for purposes of this Ordinance, <u>underlined</u> type shall constitute additions to the original text, *** shall constitute ellipses to the original text and strikethrough shall constitute deletions to the original text.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BUNNELL, FLAGLER COUNTY, FLORIDA THAT:

Section 1. Recitals.

The above "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated by reference into the Bunnell Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. Amendments.

The Bunnell Code of Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

Sec. 62-36. Definitions and Terms and Fines Imposed Herein.

The terms used in this article shall, unless otherwise specified, be defined as set forth in ch. Chapter 316, Florida Statutes F.S., as amended and attached. For the purposes of this Article, the term parking enforcement specialist shall mean a code enforcement officer, public safety officer, designated parking official or police officer. A Parking Enforcement Specialist may issue a citation and a fine for a violation of any part of this Article of \$50 except that a parking enforcement specialist may issue a citation and a fine for a disabled parking violation of Section 62-43 of \$250. A citation and a fine may be issued once every 24 hours for an ongoing or continuing violation that has not been corrected. Nothing contained herein prohibits the City from removing a vehicle as enumerated in Sec. 62-51 for any violation of this Article.

Sec. 62-40. Stopping, standing or parking in specified places <u>and schedule of</u> <u>fines</u>.

It shall be unlawful for the operator of a vehicle to stop, stand or park such vehicle in any of the following places, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a law enforcement officer or traffic-control official:

- (1) At any place where official signs or markers prohibit stopping, standing or parking;
- (2) On a crosswalk;
- (3) Upon any public sidewalk, exclusive bicycle lane or pedestrian path;
- (4) Within 15 feet of any fire hydrant;
- (5) In front of the entrance to any theater, hotel or church;
- (6) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstructions when such stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
- (7) Abreast of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge of the curb or street, or what is commonly known as double parking;
- (8) In front of a public or private driveway;
- (9) Upon any bridge or over pass;
- (10) Within 20 feet of a street intersection;
- (11) Within 30 feet of any flashing signal, stop sign, traffic control signal.
- (12) Unlawful parking of commercial vehicles in residential areas;
- (13) Leaving keys in ignition.

Sec. 62-43. Disabled parking.

<u>It shall be unlawful</u> for any person to park a motor vehicle in <u>a</u> designated disabled parking places without having affixed to such vehicle a duly authorized disabled placard

or license tag shall be in violation of this section and if found to be in violation. may be imposed with such other court costs as are provided for by law.

Sec. 62-46. Penalties.

- (a) <u>The Flagler County Court is hereby designated as the court to enforce the infraction</u> proceedings for the city.
- (b) Any person issued a <u>fine by</u> city parking ticket by a parking enforcement specialist or law enforcement officer shall be deemed to be charged with a noncriminal violation and shall comply with the direction of the ticket. If payment is not received, or a response to the ticket is not made within the time period specified on the ticket, the county court or its traffic violations bureau shall notify the registered owner of the vehicle which was cited by certified mail or by service of notice by the sheriff's deputy, of the ticket. Upon receipt of the notification, the registered owner shall comply with the court's directive.
- (c) Any person who fails to satisfy the court's directive and any person who elects to appear before a designated official to present evidence shall be deemed to have waived his right to the civil penalty provisions of the ticket. The official, after a hearing, shall make a determination as to whether a parking violation has been committed and may impose <u>a</u> fine not to exceed \$100.00 as listed in this Article plus court costs. Failure to pay the fine within 30 days from the date of disposition of the fine shall constitute a separate civil infraction enforceable by the county court in and for the county for hearing as provided in ch. 318, F.S. and shall be punishable by a civil penalty as provided in ch. 318, F.S., specifically including suspension of driver's license. Each month that the original imposed fine remains unpaid shall constitute a separate offense.
- (d) <u>All civil penalties received by the Flagler County Court from violators of this Article</u> shall be paid into the general fund of the city.
- (e) All court costs shall be retained by the Flagler County Clerk of the Circuit Court.

Sec. 62-47. Law enforcement vehicles exempt.

All law enforcement and other emergency vehicles, whether marked or unmarked, shall be exempt from the <u>issuance of any citation</u>, payment of any parking violation, penalty or fine while on official business <u>or if their assigned marked take-home vehicle</u> is parked in the street or right of way.

Sec. 62-49. Trucks prohibited from specific streets.

<u>Commercial</u> truck traffic is hereby expressly prohibited from traveling on all residential streets of the city, except for deliveries, <u>when on marked detour routes for</u> parades or events sponsored or approved by the City, <u>or due to a declared</u> state of

emergency. <u>Sanitation and Emergency Vehicles are exempt from this provision at all</u> times.

Sec. 62-51. Removal of vehicle.

<u>Chapters 316, 705, 713 and 715 Florida Statutes are adopted and incorporated in this</u> <u>Article. In addition, the City shall have the right to cause any vehicle to be impounded if</u> <u>such vehicle is in violation of any law or ordinance including but not limited to any violation</u> <u>of this Article. Upon the removal and impoundment of such vehicle, the owner shall be</u> <u>entitled to possession of same upon payment of all costs of removal, storage fees and</u> <u>fines imposed.</u>

Secs. 62-52-62-75. Reserved.

Sec. 2-79. - Disposition of civil penalties.

Sec. 62-37. Manner of parking; First offense: Warning Second offense: \$50.00 Third offense: \$100.00 Fourth offense: \$200.00

Sec. 62-40. Stopping, standing or parking in specified places; First offense: Warning Second offense: \$50.00 Third offense: \$100.00 Fourth offense: \$200.00

Sec. 62-41. Parking on private parking lots; First offense: Warning Second offense: \$50.00 Third offense: \$100.00 Fourth offense: \$200.00

Sec. 62-43. Handicapped parking; First offense: \$50.00 Second offense: \$100.00 Third offense: \$150.00 Fourth offense: \$250.00

-Sec. 62-44. Overnight parking; First offense: Warning Second offense: \$50.00 Third offense: \$100.00 Fourth offense: \$200.00

Section 3. Codification.

The provisions of this Ordinance, including its recitals, shall become and be made a part of the *Bunnell Code of Ordinance* and the Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intention and the word "Ordinance", or similar words, may be changed to "Section," "Article", or other appropriate word; provided, however, that Sections 3, 4, 5, and 6 shall not be codified. The Code codifier is granted liberal authority to codify the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Conflicts.

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance, or application hereof, is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion or application shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment.

Proposed Ordinance 2023-21 serves to protect the public health, safety, morals and welfare by creating parking restrictions and fines for public nuisances caused by illegally parked vehicles and allows parking enforcement specialist or law enforcement officers to issue parking citations and fines for certain violations.

- 2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the municipality, including the following, if any:
 - (a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur if the ordinance is enacted:

For FY 22/23 (10/01/2022 to 9/30/2023, there were 822 registered businesses within the city of Bunnell. The changes to the Bunnell Code of Ordinances proposed by Ordinance 2023-21 may impact local businesses because the new ordinance imposes penalties and prohibits violations such as parking in disabled parking spaces; crosswalks; public sidewalks, in front of fire hydrants; in front of entrances to theaters, churches, and hotels; double parking; parking commercial vehicles in residential areas; and prohibits commercial truck traffic on private streets. It is undetermined at this time the direct compliance costs enforcing Ordinance 2023-21 will have on businesses; however, it is presumed to be negligible. In addition, most restrictions contained is Ordinance 2023-21 are already codified in the City's Code of Ordinances. Ordinance 2023-21 just grants authority to parking enforcement specialists or law enforcement officers to issue parking citations and fines for violations.

(b) Identification of any new charge or fee on businesses subject to the proposed ordinance, or for which businesses will be financially responsible:

Although Ordinance 2023-21 will mostly apply to non-commercial vehicles, businesses will be imposed a \$50 citation fee for such violations as parking commercial vehicles in residential areas, and parking commercial truck traffic on private streets. Commercial vehicles may also be cited for the violations of Ordinance 2023-21's other parking prohibitions if committed by commercial vehicles.

(c) An estimate of the municipality's regulatory costs, including an estimate of revenues from any new charges or fees that will be imposed on businesses to cover such costs:

Unknown at this time. The City has collected negligible or no parking citation fees; therefore, it is impossible to determine how many parking citations and fines will be issued and assessed until a financial quarter's or fiscal year's revenues generated by citations are calculated.

For FY 22/23 (10/01/2022 to 9/30/2023, there were 822 registered businesses within the City of Bunnell.

Summary/Highlights:

RFP 2023-01 was rebid in August because the first attempt to negotiate a contract met at an impasse.

Staff is requesting permission to negotiate a contract with the bidder recommended by the Selection Committee for RFP 2023-01 Rebid.

Background:

The City was awarded \$500,000.00 through a State grant to accomplish the first phase of work needed to stabilize Coquina City Hall. The rising construction costs have affected the initial scope of work proposed for Phase 1. Time is of the essence for this project because the construction needs to be completed and the grant closed out by June 2024. The City faces extra layers of approval and review for this project because of grant funding and the building being designated a historical resource. There are financial consequences to the City for not reaching project completion and grant closeout by June 30, 2024.

The first attempt to award a contract for RFP 2023-01 met at an impasse. As a result, RFP 2023-01 was rebid in August at a reduced scope of work due to high and rising construction costs. Bid submittals were due in September.

The City received two submittals:

- H.A. Contracting Corp.
- Collage Companies

The Selection Committee met on October 5, 2023. The Selection Committee recommends staff be allowed to negotiate with Collage Companies for a contract for Restoration of the Historic Bunnell Coquina City Hall Phase 1.

Because time is of the essence to get this project started and completed, staff is also requesting the City Manager be authorized to execute the negotiated contract with City Attorney approval if the scope of work and amount agreed upon are within the budgeted amount of the grant award.

Staff Recommendation:

Approve Permission to Negotiate with Collage Companies for RFP 2023-01 Restoration of Coquina City Hall Phase 1 as recommended by the Selection Committee and Authorize the City Manager to Execute a Contract within the Budgeted Grant Award Amount.

City Clerk Bates explained the overall concept for the facility has been completed and based on construction costs and obtainable funding, each phase of the restoration would have an RFP.

The committee agreed Collage would be recommend for the project.

HISTORIC TAMPA UNION STATION RENOVATION

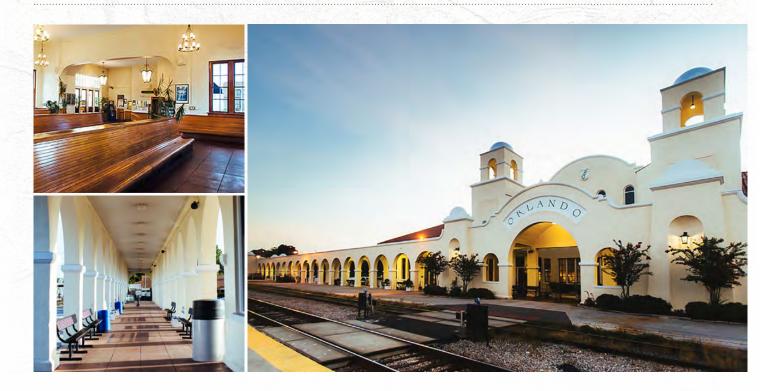

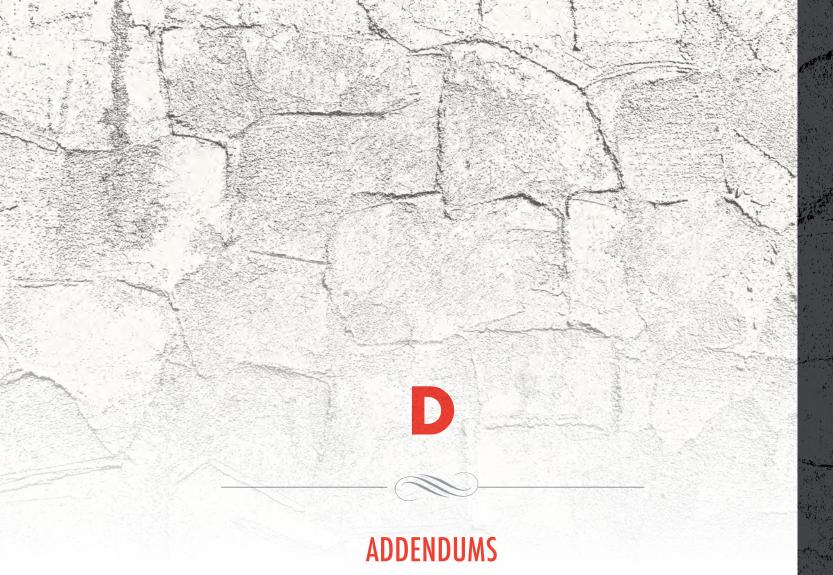

A. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

1) Question 1: Where do you obtain bidding documents?

Answer 1: Other than the documents published in pages 45 to 71 of the RFP, there are no other specific bid documents to be used. Documents to be used in the submission are identified in the previously mentioned pages as "Bid Submission Documents" in the footer of those pages.

The AIA documents, stated to be used during the project and as stated within the RFP, are available for download in a fillable format from the AIA website: <u>www.aia.org</u> The contractor would be responsible for downloading the fillable version of any applicable AIA forms for this project from the website. The City would not reimburse these costs as they are a cost for doing business and not reimbursable under the grant funding.

2) Question 2: Is there additional information as to the projected budget?

Answer 2: Phase One of this project is funded through a Department of State Special Category Grant. The budget for Phase One is the grant amount of \$500,000.00. At this time, there are no additional funds budgeted to cover costs of Phase One outside of the grant award. Bidders should provide a breakdown of the items as listed in the RFP Scope of work and the cost for each of those items even if the total cost will exceed the funded amount. A breakdown per item is required to determine what can be included in Phase One and if amending the grant contract and scope of work will be required.

3) Question 3: Is there additional information as to liquidated damages?

Answer 3: Liquidated damages and penalties for failing to complete the job by the deadline would be addressed during contract negotiations and agreed to by both parties prior to being executed.

The grant must be closed out by June 2024. The project must be completed in time to meet the State reporting deadlines for the grant.

4) Question 4: We just acquired our GC license in the state of Florida this summer but have been performing work under previous General Contractors for 40 years. We have also been performing work as a General Contractor in Georgia, Alabama, and Tennessee for 40 years performing this scope of work. Would we still be eligible to bid your job?

Answer 4: Bidders should have their Florida Contractor license at the time of bid submission; there is not sufficient time to allow a contractor currently not licensed in the State of Florida, to obtain their Florida license and still meet project deadlines. The 5 years' experience requirement listed in the RFP can be in other states and is not required or intended to be 5 years' experience in the State of Florida. Additionally, the qualification statement is not intended to require having a Florida Contractor license for 5 years, but to have 5 years' experience in this type of work.

1) Question 1: Does the Builder have to carry Builder's Risk Insurance?

Answer 1: Not required.

2) Question 2: Is there lead in any parts of the building?

Answer 2: The building has areas of leaded paint including on the wood side entry doors, frames, metal strap door hinges and at the metal vault door and frame. See the location and reading results in the Project Manual, Report of Pre-Renovation Survey for Asbestos-Containing Materials and screening for Leaded Coatings.

3) Question 3: Are photographs of the original structure and the crawl space available?

Answer 3: Photographs of the original structure and crawl space are included in this addendum. Photographs are for reference only. The bidder is expected to visit the site and familiarize themselves with the building to understand the requirements of the bid documents.

4) Question 4: Are there plans available of the vault addition.

Answer 4: No plans are available for the vault addition.

5) Question 5: Is there a void or space between the Office Coquina wall and the CMU wall of the Vault Room Addition?

Answer 5: The City removed one of the CMU blocks from the most southern vault wall and at this location, the vault wall has an approximate ³/₄" void between the office coquina wall and the CMU vault wall. Notice the CMU blocks are hollow and NOT filled with concrete. Please see below vault wall photos for more detail. Contractors are welcome to come view the new Vault wall hole. Appointments through the RFP contact should be made to ensure the facility can be opened.

6) Question 6: What is the panel on the wall by the safe into the adjacent room? There are hinges on both sides of this panel.

Answer 6: The panel was most likely used to fill in the original window opening in the coquina block on the interior when the vault room was added.

7) Question 7: Are the ceiling and floorings part of Phase 1?

Answer 7: Refer to pre bid documents.

8) Question 8: Is it possible to arrange a time to visit the building?

Answer 8: Contact City Clerk Kristen Bates at <u>kbates@bunnellcity.us</u> or 386-263-8808 to arrange a time to access the building. Due to staff availability and duties, there is limited time to arrange additional visits to the building. City staff is not available on weekends.

9) Question 9: Can the floor be removed to work in the crawl space and beams?

Answer 9: There are two existing openings that can be utilized to gain access to the crawl space. The existing exterior crawl space access is located under the rear kitchen addition. In the Auditorium there is also an area of missing hardwood flooring. This area can be used to gain access to the crawl space from above. The plywood subfloor in this area is required to be reinstalled at the completion of the repairs in the crawl space. If areas of the existing wood floors are required to be reinoved to conduct the repairs in the crawl space, the contractor is required to reinstall the wood floors to match existing adjacent wood floors after the work is completed.

10) Question 10: Does the plywood paneling on historic doors need to be removed?

Answer 10: The T1-11 that has been applied to the inside of the side wood doors should be removed during the door restoration work.

11) Question11: Is there office space for contractors?

Answer 11: Contractors may utilize the large storage area in the southeast corner of the building for office space.

12) Question 12: Is there secure storage available for the contractors?

Answer 12: An onsite storage unit could be allowed; however, the street and driveway around Coquina City Hall and Lake Lucille are used by a private school in the area for student drop-off/pick-up. None of the streets behind the building or around Lake Lucille should be blocked during the project at any time to ensure there is no impediment to the private school operations for drop-off/pick-up.

Additionally, no grass should be destroyed or damaged by placing a container in a grassy area. The parking spaces immediately in front of the building and the on-street parking spaces immediately behind the building are the only location to place an onsite storage container. Please place plywood under the container to protect the pavement.

The fenced parking area behind the building is private parking and does not belong to the City. This fenced in area should not be used for the project or blocked at any time during the project.

14) Question 14: What are the directions about the road closure around the building?

Answer 14: The site must not affect the flow of traffic on South Pine Street, East Court Street nor the driveway around Lake Lucille used for student drop-off/pick-up traffic. The parking spaces immediately behind the Coquina Building should be blocked off during construction, but when doing so the use of South Pine Street should not be affected.



15) Question 15: When removing the ramp will the stairway stoop also need to be removed?

Answer 15: The original concrete stoop and coquina knee wall to remain. See Architectural sheet D-1 for extent of demolition.

16) Question 16: Is this a Design-Build project?

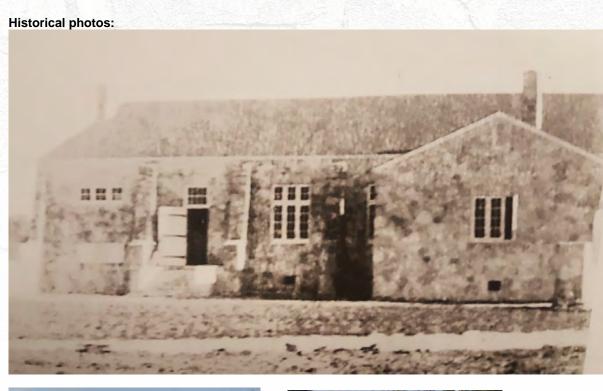

This project consists of complete demolition of a 40,000 sf public school located in Miami, FL. Demolition consisted of all architectural and MEP elements, existing wood floor joists systems, existing concrete columns, and tie beam. This commercial project consists of renovating 273 hotel rooms, offices, lobby and the patio bar representing 75,000 sf of the 650,000 sf Historic Biltmore Hotel.

The scope includes structural concrete repairs to the existing slabs, and existing tie beams and columns.  - Design is complete and approved by both the State and Federal governments. Because of the historic designation on this building, any design plans need to be approved by the State and Division of Historical Resources.
 - The RFP for construction was released in March and the City is working on a contract with a construction company so the first phase of the restoration of the hall can begin.
 - To fully restore Coquina City Hall (given current construction costs), the City will need to invest over \$1 million into the facility,
- Municipal Park is at its new location: 1307 E. Howe Street (former Clegg Property)

Garage Sale Permits:

The City is accepting requests for Garage Sale Permits. Residents need to make their request to the Utility Billing Department. Per the City Code of Ordinance, there is a limit on the total number of garage sale permits that can be issued to a property/address point in a calendar year. Speak with the staff in Utility Billing for any questions regarding Garage Sale Permits 386-437-7500 x 3.

Information Technology

Borrowed equipment from the County once again and participated in the annual ethics training for the Board.

Spending a lot of time installing and configuring the various software we have received from the State Cybersecurity grant. The State is providing licensing for various security products. Started installing new End Point Security software. Setting up and running various security scans on our internal network to identify security concerns. Then tracking down the source and mitigating them.

And a lot of time in to the design of the new building. Participated in at least 3 half day or longer meetings on the subject. Met with Collage, and the County AV Coordinator at the GSB for a walk through of the County facility and capabilities. On top of reviewing information provided.

Upgrade the storage for the security cameras at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, and Public Works. One of the departments wanted continuous recording instead of only on motion. Added storage to the recorder, and set all of the cameras. Doesn't guite store 30 days as required by the State for retention. So we are experimenting with a recording schedule where it records only on motion at night, and continuous through a production day.

One of the desktop printers in Finance was acting up, and parts were not readily available for it. Purchased and installed a new laser printer. Also, Infrastructure purchased an inkjet printer for the Water Plant.

Upgraded the security cameras at the Water Plant. The recording software for this system was utilizing a very old Windows 7 machine. Upgraded to a similar recorder as is used at the Wastewater Plant, added a camera and reconfigured the cameras. The water plant has fewer cameras than located at Public Works and Wastewater plant. So this is retaining more than the 30 days necessary.

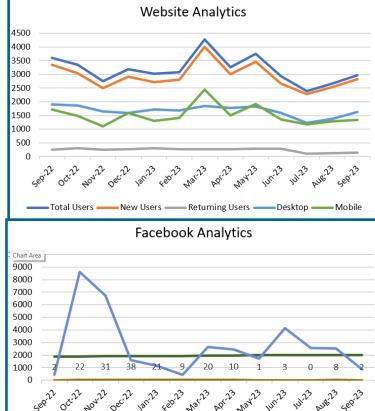

City Clerk Office

The City Clerk Office published and noticed agendas for the City's Public meetings held in August. Public Meetings are City Commission meetings, workshops and Executive Strategy Sessions, Union Meetings, and any Volunteer Board meetings such as the Planning, Zoning and Appeals Board and Code Enforcement Board.

The Clerk's Office also worked on the following issues throughout the month:

- Working with contractor for the design for reconstruction of Coquina City Hall and on-going contact with Department of State for the Historical Resources Grant for the restoration of Coquina City Hall (agreements executed in October). A reduced scope of work is being prepared and plans will need to be approved.
- Review and editing of new City Personnel Policy Manual.
- The RFP for Coquina Reconstruction Phase 1 was re-bid with a reduced scope of work. It was released on August 14, 2023. The Mandatory Pre-Bid meeting was held August 29, 2023. Bid opening was held September 19, 2023. The Selection Committee will meet to score/rank bids for a recommendation to the City Commission.
- Contract for new solid waste dumping fees negotiated and taken to the City Commission for execution.

Business Tax Receipts (BTRs)

All notices for FY 23/24 were mailed out to the address of record for each registered business the last week of June. If you have questions about BTR renewal, please contact the Deputy City Clerk at 386-263-8981.

Businesses should pay their BTR Renewal fees by **September 30, 2023** to avoid paying penalties and/or code enforcement action. Florida Statute and the City's Code of Ordinance require penalties be added to a BTR if not paid by **September 30th**. The required penalties are as follows: 10% October 1st; 15% November 1st; 20% December 1st; and 25% January 1st. The City does not have the authority to waive penalties.

In the month of September 264 businesses either renewed their BTR or received their initial BTR. The City collected \$28,694.90 in BTR and Fire Inspection fees in September; this includes the fees for renewals and newly issued local business tax receipts.

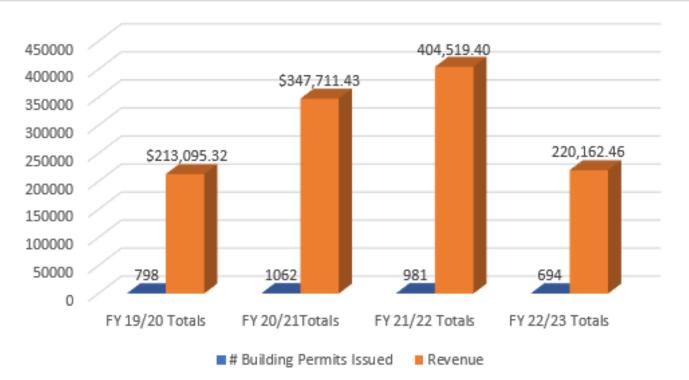

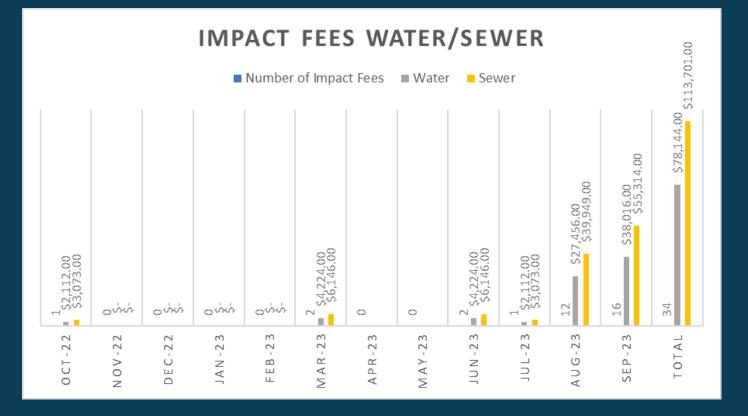

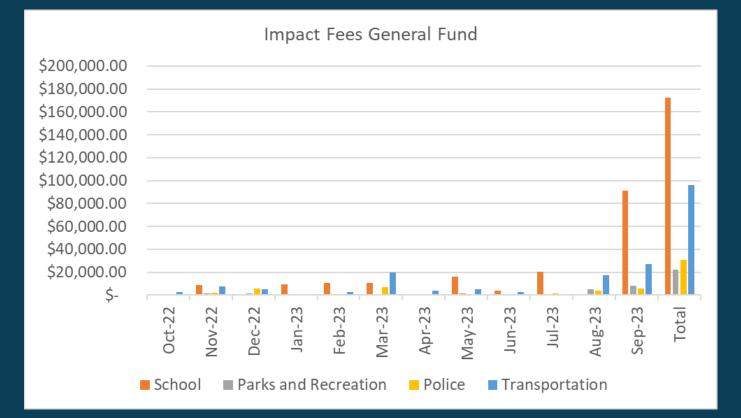

Cart Placement Regulations and Guidelines

- ⇒ Face lid opening of cart toward the street (handles & wheels facing house)
- \Rightarrow Place front of cart within 3 feet of street edge
- \Rightarrow Allow 2 to 3 feet of clearance on each side of all carts and <u>ANY</u> obstruction
- \Rightarrow Do NOT fill carts with construction debris, dirt or yard waste
- ⇒ It is recommended to place carts out the night before. The driver is not able to turn around if your cart is not out when the truck has passed your location
- ⇒ Do not place carts near parked cars, fences, mailboxes, trees, other carts, or any other obstruction that could interfere with the truck picking up your cart.

Failing to follow the guidelines may result in service interruption (i.e. the City won't be able to collect your solid waste that day)
